Background

The establishment of the development project divisionat the society in 2002

In 2003, the sewing operationstarted with 10 artisans trained in the craft of patchwork producing clothing, blankets and other house accesories

In 2004, the operation evolved to excersice various arts of sewing and embroidery and especially the art of crochet which led to the variety of output

In 2005, the number of artisans participating in the program soard to 30, some working full-time at the establishment and others working from home

In 2006, the number of artisans benefiting from the program increased to 40

in 2007, with the appreciated cooperation of the Islamic Bank for Development in Jeddah helped organize three embroidery workshops
